The central question here is, why, in spite of the fact that crimes committed by African Americans have held level for the last 20 years, are African Americans incarcerated at nearly seven times the level of whites? The answer is a devastating indictment of the Reagan-Bush "repressive crime control policies," which have had the effect of targeting minorities for punishment, especially African Americans. Tonry (coauthor, *Between Prison and Probation*, 1991) provides detailed discussion and analysis of patterns that result when an African American is thrust into the criminal system. His most damning critique concerns the War on Drugs crusade, which, though it failed to make a noticeable dent in the drug trade, did succeed in what Tonry sees as the larger goal--increasing the number of African Americans in the prison system.
